Abstract:

Nursing home workers are susceptible to accidental muscle injuries due to their physically demanding work – particularly from lifting and transferring of patients.

Our goal was to create a training DVD for new and existing employees in a skilled nursing setting that presents best practices relating to transferring, lifting, repositioning and moving patients. Public domain videos on the subject were found to be outdated, too lengthy to sustain viewer interest, utilizing manequins and were filmed in a hospital or at-home setting. We hoped to create an effective DVD appropriate to train skilled nursing facility staff. Experienced nursing staff worked with a professional videographer to create the final product. The project was initiated in 2013 but ran into two very large obstacles. We lost our program director as well as the videographer. Rather than scrap this worthwhile project, I took over as program director and contracted with another videographer.

Purpose of Project:

The project was intended to provide an effective training tool for new and current nursing assistants in good body mechanic techniques. As a result of improved training we hope to prevent injuries, reduce L&I claims and time loss for staff who routinely move patients. We also seek to improve patient safety and comfort. All new nursing staff, including licensed nurses, will be required to view this DVD.

The completed DVD has been used in our certified nursing assistant classes with good feedback from the students. The DVD allows them to see how to safely use mechanical lifts while maintaining good body mechanics. New nursing staff are required to view the DVD as well.

Our L&I Claims have significantly dropped since completion of the DVD:

7/1/13-6/30/14 - 29 claims \$199,132 1000 days time loss

7/1/14-6/30/15 - 26 claims \$83,824 69 days time loss

7/1/15-6/30/16 - 13 claims \$20,635 No time loss

Communication with Caprice Catalano at SHIP/L&I office was very helpful in staying on course and completing each step.

This was a new adventure for me. I had never been part of a project such as this and when we had the loss of the Program Director and the Videographer within a short time frame, I stepped up and took over. I had no idea what I was getting into. Looking back, the process isn't that complicated but it does demand a lot of time before, during and after the DVD is created. I definitely learned a bigger appreciation for what goes into filming, expecially the re-takes, the re-scheduling and just the time it took. This is a collaborative effort requiring time by the organization's administrator, payroll and accounting staff, employees who volunteered to be "actors", staff responsible for scriptwriting. etc. Communication is very important. We found that emails work, but also phone contact and personal visits by the Project Director have been helpful. Scheduling group meetings proved to be difficult because there were too many interruptions and conflicting schedules to make it productive.

Product Dissemination:

Outline of how the products of the project have been shared or made transferrable. There were 150 copies of the DVD prepared. A total of 50 DVD's were provided to Caprice Catalano at SHIP for sharing with whomever requests the DVD. The majority of the copies were set aside for training as well as copies to each person that took part in the DVD creation. Our CEO notified Leading Age and Lutheran Community Services Northwest of the availability of the DVD.

Feedback:

The students in the nursing assistant class and a few of the new employees, to include a new RN, said they thought it was a very good DVD and were glad it covered mechanical lifts. Previously the DVD's we train with were outdated. This DVD is now part of our required staff training.

New staff as well as others will be able to view this DVD in whole or by chapters to learn or review a particular area of the DVD such as body mechanics, transfer techniques or mechanical lifts. Proper lifting and transporting techniques are necessary to prevent workplace injuries. Lifting and transporting are an ongoing daily job requirement in a skilled nursing facility. Good technique protects both the employee and the patient.
